





# What is it?

Presbyterianism is a branch off of the Protestant Church that is <u>founded on the concept of democratic</u> <u>rule under the Word of God</u>. In Greek, the word prebyteros means <u>"elder"</u>, which describes the way by which the church is governed.

- Teaching Elders Ministers/Pastors/Preachers
- Ruling Elders Deacons and Trustees



# What Is It?

- 1643 Westminster Confession of Faith was written and now recognized as the basic creed of English-speaking Presbyterians
- 1640s 1650s John Calvin, known as the "Father" of Presbyterianism, developed the Reformed Theological Doctrines





# What Is It?


- Believe Christ is spiritually present in the Lord's Supper
- Holy Trinity is frequently used in worship
  - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (three manifestations of God himself)
- Two main sources for inspiration and guidance in their faith
  - The Bible
  - Creeds and Confessions (Apostles' Creed, Westminster)












## Why I Chose This Topic

# My Approach

 My approach is to have an informational section where topics such as sexuality, the gender binary, and pronouns are discussed, followed by an interactive portion for people to practice what they have learned and how to approach certain situations





# What is gender?

- Gender social and legal status as well as a set of expectations from society about behaviors, characteristics, and thoughts
- Gender Identity how one feels on the inside and how you express your gender through clothing, behavior, and person appearance



## What is the gender binary?

- Gender binary system that classifies sex and gender into a pair of opposites, often imposed by culture, religion, or other societal pressures
  - Human population man or woman
  - Can be useful and sometimes <u>accurate for</u> classification
  - Can cause <u>discrimination</u> against individuals who are non-binary, gender nonconforming, or transgender



## Sexus. Gender

#### Sex

- Refers to genetic and biological characteristics
- Chromosomes and sexual anatomy

#### Gender

- Social consequences of these characteristics
- Combination of cultural influence and pressure


## Pronouns

- "A word that can function by itself as a noun phrase and that refers either to the participants in the discourse (e.g. I, you) or to someone/something mentioned elsewhere in the discourse (e.g. she, it, this)" (Oxford Languages)
- "Pronouns are basically how we identify ourselves apart from our name. It's how someone refers to you in a conversation" (Mary Emily O'Hara, NPR)



## Pronouns

- Asking for pronouns can be a way to show people that you see them for who they are, or who they choose to present themselves as.
- It shows that you accept them for who they are
- Introducing yourself with pronouns also creates
   a safe space for queer and non-queer individuals
   to be inclusive and accepting



## Pronouns 101

Туре	Name	Example
Feminine	She, her, her	She went to the store. I spoke to her. It was her apple.
Masculine	He, him, his	He went to the store. I spoke to him. It was his apple.
Gender Neutral	They, them, their	They went to the store. I spoke to them. It was their apple.
Gender Neutral	Ze, zir/zem, zirs/zes	Ze went to the store. I spoke to zir/zem. It was zirs/zes apple.
Gender Neutral	Ze, hir, hirs	Ze went to the store. I spoke to hir. It was hirs apple.

Please note that these are not the only pronouns. There are an infinite number of pronouns as new ones emerge in our language.



## The Church's Stance

#### Marriage

- Ministers can use their own discernment to conduct same-sex marriages where allowed by law
- Updated language in the Book of Order
  to describe marriage as "a unique
  commitment between two people,
  traditionally a man and a woman"

### Ordination

 LGBTQ ministers may be ordained at the discretion of individual presbyteries and sessions (congregations)

## The Church's Stance


#### Discrimination

 No exclusion based on "race, ethnicity, sex, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religion, or gender expression"

#### Sexual Orientation

 Full welcome, acceptance, and inclusion of transgender, nonbinary, and gender-fluid people within the full life of the church






## What Does The Bible Say

- Creation and Gender Binary
  - Genesis 1:27
    - Created male and female, day and night (binary)
    - God's creation exists in spectrums and in the same way
       makes each person unique that don't fit into boxes
  - Genesis 2: 18-24
    - Non-gendered human is created first, followed by Adam
       and Eve (God created two fundamentally different genders
    - Argument whether trans people are a result of the fall or part of God's plan



## What Does The Bible Say

- Being wonderfully made Pslam 139:13–14
  - Implies that we are all created with love and intention and that every part of us was divinely formed (both our bodies and <u>inner</u> knowledge of self)
